Hello SCCM Texas Chapter Members!!

I hope that you are all safe and on your way to recovery after Harvey. It was amazing to see the healthcare community, including many of our members band together to take care of patients and assist in the community during the storm. We should all be proud of the way that Texas rallied together in this time of need.

The Texas Chapter has remained busy over the last several months. Last month, we reached a new membership high with 565 members, with over 50 members involved in a volunteer position! 
# Membership Committee Update

### Who Should Attend?

The PFCCS curriculum is intended to introduce principles important in the initial care of critically ill/injured pediatric patients.

Candidates include physicians, physicians-in-training, nurses, and other health care providers who may or may not be skilled in critical care, but who must care for such patients during early stabilization and in anticipation of the arrival of an intensivist or specialist, or pending transfer to a tertiary center.

We are now accepting registrations for the Pediatric Fundamental Critical Care Support (PFCCS) course to be held **February 22 – 23, 2018 at The Children's Hospital of San Antonio**. This is a pre-congress course in conjunction with the 47th Critical Care Congress in San Antonio.

PFCCS is a structured course developed by the Society of Critical Care Medicine (SCCM). This two-day program includes in-depth and comprehensive balance of didactic lectures and hands-on skill stations to include pre- and post- testing. SCCM offers a course completion card to those who successfully complete the course.
